


Classic Yacht Association

In 1969, a handful of enthusiasts occasionally met to discuss their love for fine old power driven wooden boats. As time passed, they recognized that many others shared this interest by maintaining their older vessels in a bristol condition. As the list of enthusiasts grew, they decided to organize for the purpose of perpetuating this mutual interest and establishing standards of acceptance to the Association.

Thus the Classic Yacht Association was formed. Its purpose as stated in the By-Laws is "to promote and encourage an interest in the preservation, restoration and maintenance of fine old power driven pleasure craft." The qualifications are that the vessel shall be of good design, construction and maintenance, built prior to December 31, 1942 which shows no exterior alterations to distract from the designer's original intent.

Additionally, the objectives are to promote, sponsor and develop yachting activities of this Association and to cultivate a spirit of friendship among its members. The Classic Yacht Association has developed into just that type of organization as envisioned by our founders. We are grateful for their foresite and dedicate this publication to them. This collection of our vessels is as we see Classic Yachting today.

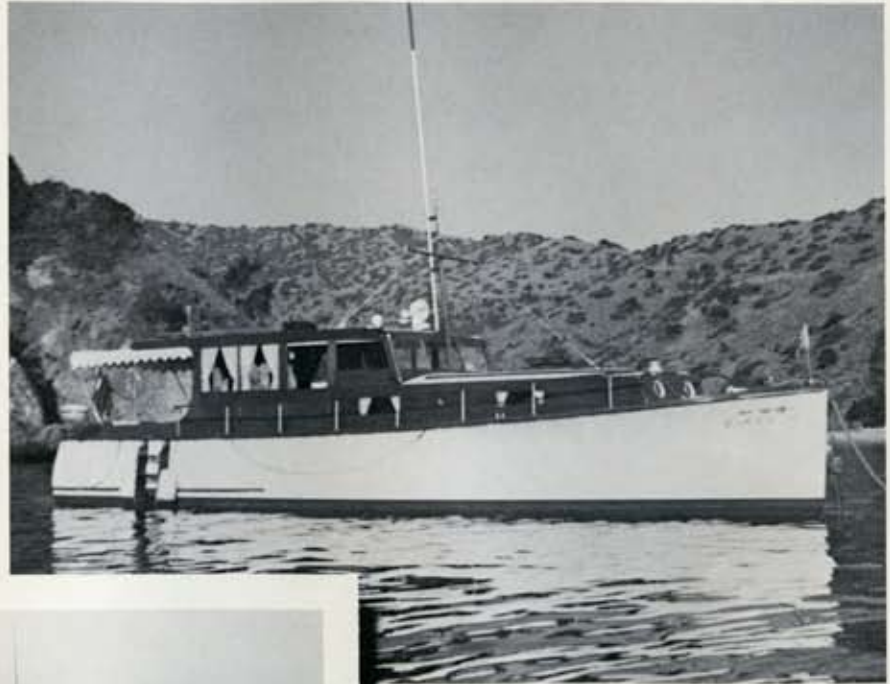
Sea Doll II
